SPA and SHS Policy Guide Update



Proposed SPA and Timeline

- All SPA docs have been submitted for the January 28 public hearing
- State Plan Amendment (SPA) to Attachment 3.1-A, page 2 will allow **School Counselors**, **School Social Workers**, and **School Psychologists** holding a Department of Education endorsement to bill for allowable school health services that fall within their licensure and scope of practice.
- Anticipated effective date of January 1, 2025
- Process & Timeline for approval
 - State preparation and submission includes SPA language, fiscal impact analysis, etc.
 - CMS review period 90 days to approve the SPA or issue a Request for Additional Information (RAI) to DHCFP
 - State response If RAI is issued, NV has 90 days to respond.
 - Final CMS decision CMS has another 90 days to approve, RAI, or disapprove SPA



SHS Policy Guide Updates

- DHCFP is currently working on finalizing the MSM 2800 changes and updates to prepare for public hearing on February 25. Key updates include:
 - Modifying the chapter format to reflect its regulatory nature
 - Updating authorities
 - Covered services and documentation requirements combined into one section
- The corresponding SHS Guide is going through final edits and remediation. DHCFP anticipates the guide to be published by the end of the month.
- Once finalized, DHCFP will publish both resources to the SHA Resource Center website and include this information in the announcement to LEAs

Information Collection

• Over the past month, DHCFP has conducted additional targeted outreach to LEAs to inform recommendations for the state-option EHR / billing system

• 8 survey responses from participating and non-participating LEAs to collect more detailed information on current systems and documentation processes

 7 informational interviews with 6 LEAs, representing a spectrum of size and resource capacity, current program participation status, and populations of focus

Findings

 Significant variance across LEAs in data management, Medicaid billing practices, and EHR usage is leading to administrative burdens and inconsistent Medicaid participation

- Challenges include:
 - inconsistent systems integration,
 - lack of standardized data collection and processes,
 - insufficient systems training and administrative support for LEAs and their practitioners



Findings

 Lack of standardized data collection processes underscores the need for a statewide approach to EHR integration, Medicaid billing, and data interoperability

 While LEAs express interest in enhanced system functionality, standardized Medicaid documentation, and cost-effective solutions, concerns remain regarding system rigidity, scalability, and documentation burden

 Addressing these challenges will be critical to ensuring broader participation and long-term sustainability

 Discussion with DHCFP leadership and development of initial system and procurement recommendations

 Presentation of recommendations and feedback from SHA Steering Committee at next scheduled meeting (February 26)

 Update to LEAs on status of procurement and recommendations in March 2025
