#### Nevada Medicaid School Health Services Program Guide

This guide is a resource for Local Education Agencies (LEAs) in Nevada regarding the Medicaid School Health Services (SHS) program. The guide provides step-by-step instructions for enrolling as a Medicaid provider, billing for covered health services, and ensuring compliance with state and federal requirements. It supports schools in delivering medically necessary services to Medicaid-eligible students, including guidance on documentation, eligibility verification, and service limitations.

The regulatory information presented in this guide is subject to change and is pending approval through the Public Hearing process. The anticipated effective date is May 28th, 2025.

EPSDT / Healthy Kids Program

Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment (EPSDT) is a Medicaid program that helps kids and teens under age 21 get the health care they need. The program provides regular checkups to find and address health issues early. EPSDT covers things like doctor visits, mental health care, dental checkups, vision and hearing tests.








# **Overview of RFP**

- As a reminder, the EHR and school billing system RFP reflects information collected from LEAs and other stakeholders through:
  - Surveys,
  - Informational interviews,
  - Data analysis, and
  - The SHA Steering Committee.
- This information indicates that a state-option EHR and school billing system will help to address many of the billing-related challenges LEAs face today.

# System Rollout and Pilot Strategy

- The DHCFP intends to utilize a pilot strategy to implement the EHR and school billing system.
- The size, makeup, and timeline for the rollout of Cohort 1 will depend, in part, on negotiations with the selected vendor.
  - Cohort 1 is expected to go live during the 2026-2027 school year.
- DHCFP's intent is to achieve diverse representation among Cohort 1 LEAs.
- Participation in Cohort 1 is voluntary and will require an application and/or letter of intent from interested LEAs.
  - DHCFP will have discretion over selected LEAs.

# **CMS Grant Reporting Schedule**

- Since the last Steering Committee meeting, DHCFP submitted the:
  - Q3 Progress Report
  - Year 2 Non-Competing Continuation Application for Budget Year 2 funding (begins 7/1/2025)
- CMS TAC provided positive feedback on DHCFP's last submissions.
- DHCFP continues to engage with CMS TAC regularly.
- The Q4 Progress Report is due July 31.



# Data Reporting Update

- The next annual data report is due January 30, 2026.
- DHCFP continues to collaborate with the Office of Analytics and Nevada Department of Education.
  - MOU pending final approval
  - Data sharing agreement may be needed

# **Program Evaluation Framework**

- DHCFP is developing a program evaluation framework to measure the success of the SHS program, both under the CMS SBS Grant and beyond.
- Indicators will aim to measure both short- and long-term goals related to the increased provision of and billing for non-IEP services. Overarching questions include:
  - <u>What</u> is the Nevada SHS program doing?
  - <u>How well</u> is the Nevada SHS program doing?
  - What is the <u>impact</u> of the NV SHS program?
- At the next Steering Committee meeting, DHCFP intends to preview:
  - Selected indicators/metrics
  - The logic model underpinning the program evaluation framework



# Second Annual School Survey

- The Second Annual School Survey was open throughout April.
- DHCFP received responses from 17 out of 18 LEAs.
- High-level analysis of responses:
  - PT, OT, and Speech Services are most frequently billed.
  - Billing for non-IEP services was limited, but some LEAs have billed for non-IEP nursing, screening, and/or mental health services.
  - Between policy, communication, technology, and billing, billing remains the most significant challenge LEAs face today.
- DHCFP will share more in-depth analysis and findings at a later date.



# SPA, MSM 2800 & SHS Program Guide Update



# State Plan Amendment (SPA)

- SPA (NV 25-0005) allows School Counselors, School Social Workers, and School Psychologists holding a Department of Education endorsement to provide covered school health services that fall within their licensure and scope of practice.
- CMS approved the SPA on April 9, 2025, with an effective date of January 1, 2025.
- DHCFP hosted a Q&A session on May 2, 2025.
  - Materials have been posted to the SHA Resource Center in the 'SHS Office Hours' tab.
- DHCFP and the Nevada Speech-Language Hearing Association are collaborating on a crosswalk, which was the primary request of new provider types allowed under the SPA.
- What types/format of information would be most helpful in guiding the successful implementation of the SPA? Are there any best practices or lessons learned related to SPA implementation/inclusion of additional provider types?



# MSM and SHS Program Guide Updates

- DHCFP held a Public Hearing on May 27 to review the MSM 2800, which became effective on May 28.
- The accompanying SHS Program Guide has been posted to the SHA Resource Center, with a disclaimer that the regulatory information is subject to the approval and finalization of the MSM chapter.
- The guide provides step-by-step instructions for enrolling as a Medicaid provider, billing for covered health services, and ensuring compliance with state and federal requirements.
