• **Challenge:** Inconsistent understanding of SHS across stakeholders in a given LEA/district (e.g., superintendents, principals, teachers, providers, etc.)

Discussion Questions:

- Where is the communication breakdown happening?
- What new or different methods of communication might be more effective in creating a common understanding of the value of SHS? Are there existing venues NVHA should consider leveraging (e.g., district meetings, etc.)
- What messaging would be most effective (e.g., centering Medicaid-covered SHS as a strategy to address behavioral health challenges)?
- What practices have proven effective in garnering buy-in across stakeholders, even if they are not specific to SHS?

Reporting Updates

- NVHA received the Year 2 Notice of Award on July 1
 - Budget Period 2 extends from July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026
- Q4 Progress Report is due to CMS by July 30th
- Budget Period 1 Annual Federal Financial Report is due September 28
- NVHA continues to meet regularly with CMS TAC



Data Collection Efforts

- The next annual data report is due January 30, 2026
- NVHA continues to collaborate with the Office of Analytics and NDE
 - Data Sharing Agreement between NVHA and NDE is nearly executed


Responses Overview

Does your LEA/School District currently bill Nevada Medicaid for School Health Services?



Services Billed for Outside of IEPs



Nevada Medicaid Challenges Ranked

Rank the challenges your LEA is facing based on greatest impact to least.

- Billing confusion about what services are billable and which codes to use
 Billing do not have sufficient staff/capacity
 Billing difficulty collecting required information to bill (e.g., documentation of service, POC, parental consent)
- 4. Policy confusion about Billing Guide
- 5. Policy confusion about MSM 2800
- 6. Communication parents/other stakeholders do not understand SHS
- 7. Lack of technology or technology systems are too complicated
- 8. Communication do not know who to contact at NV Medicaid for assistance


How would you rate your overall experience in billing Nevada Medicaid for School Health Services during the current school year? Please rate your agreement with the following statements.

Clear, Aligned Billing Guidance

- Complete Medicaid billing guide, manual, and fee schedule
- List of billable services and codes by provider type
- Quick reference on billing limits & reimbursement



Consent & Compliance Support

- Guidance on parental consent, HIPAA, FERPA, audit prep
- Sample consent forms and documentation checklists



Templates & Best Practices

- Editable forms, service logs, and IEPspecific tools
- Examples of successful district practices



Training & Technical Assistance

- Virtual walkthrough for all counties
- Guidance on integrating systems like Infinite Campus
- Simple "Getting Started" guide for schools (e.g., for nurses, ABA)



Top Ideas for Technical Assistance

If NV Medicaid could facilitate one type of technical assistance activity on a regular basis, what would it look like?



Billing Code Support

- Clear guidance on billable codes by provider type
- Quick-reference tools with limits, scope, and CPT codes
- Help navigating billing agent processes

Note: As a result of this feedback, a SMART Resource is in development



Ongoing Training & Problem Solving

- Monthly Medicaid + NDE sessions to tackle common challenges
- Open office hours or coaching for districtspecific questions



Improved Communication

- Regular updates on billing changes
- Direct, consistent engagement from NV Medicaid

- 100% of LEAs are aware of the opportunity to bill Nevada Medicaid for health services
- 75% of LEAs participate in at least one TA training on billing for non-IEP services.
- At least one new or revised TA resource is developed every year that is responsive to challenges and barriers facing LEAs.

- 100% of LEAs are enrolled and billing Nevada Medicaid
- 40% of claims billed by LEAs are for non-IEP/504 services

- Increased funding for school health services
- More school health services, aligned with the state's MTSS framework
- Improved health and education outcomes for students (i.e., decrease in chronic absenteeism/ suspension, increase in attendance)



Program Evaluation Framework: Audiences

Program Evaluation Framework: Evaluation Questions

- 1. What is the Nevada Medicaid School Health Services (SHS) program doing to expand LEA participation in the program and increase access to SHS, including non-IEP services?
- 2. How effective is the Nevada Medicaid SHS program in expanding participation and increasing billing through the program, including for non-IEP services?
- 3. What is the impact on students of increased LEA participation and billing through the Nevada Medicaid SHS program?



Program Evaluation Framework: Metrics

Evaluation Question 1: What is the Nevada Medicaid SHS program doing to expand LEA participation in the program and increase access to SHS?

Program Evaluation Framework: Metrics (continued)

Evaluation Question 2: How effective is the Nevada Medicaid SHS program in expanding participation and increasing billing through the program?

Metric

of LEAs that are enrolled and actively billing the program

% of Medicaid eligible students that attend an LEA enrolled in the Nevada Medicaid SHS program

of students and % of school population receiving a Medicaid-billable service by county

% of Provider Type 60 claims that are for non-IEP services

% of Provider Type 60 claims for non-IEP services that are for mental health services (equation = claims with mental health procedure codes and non-IEP modifiers/claims with non-IEP modifiers)



Program Evaluation Framework: Metrics (continued)

Evaluation Question 3: What is the impact on students of increased LEA participation and billing through the Nevada Medicaid SHS program?

Metric

% of LEAs reporting that billing revenue supports increased investment in school health services/staffing

% of students receiving a Medicaid-billable service in school (via Provider Type 60) that would not otherwise have received/accessed Medicaid services

of school health personnel employed by LEAs

% of students that are chronically absent by LEA
