
- Recent Updates

 - Some requirements may not be fully satisfied in the report due to systems challenges with recent cyber event
- The next annual data report is due January 30, 2026

- Drafting initial program evaluation report



Program Evaluation Framework: Evaluation Questions

- 1. What is the Nevada Medicaid School Health Services (SHS) program doing to expand LEA participation in the program and increase access to SHS, including non-IEP services?
- 2. How effective is the Nevada Medicaid SHS program in expanding participation and increasing billing through the program, including for non-IEP services?
- 3. What is the impact on students of increased LEA participation and billing through the Nevada Medicaid SHS program?



Final Program Evaluation Metrics

Evaluation Question 1: What is the Nevada Medicaid SHS program doing to expand LEA participation in the program and increase access to SHS?

Metric

Number of new technical assistance resources each year

Number of participants and LEAs participating in TA activities

Number of LEAs that participated in the annual school survey

Number of in-person site visits at LEAs

LEAs' overall experience with billing Nevada Medicaid SHS

2024-25 Evaluation Snapshot

47 participants and representatives from 10 LEAs attended at least one TA activity in 2024-25 school year.



Final Program Evaluation Metrics

Evaluation Question 2: How effective is the Nevada Medicaid SHS program in expanding participation and increasing billing through the program?


Metric

Number of LEAs that are enrolled and actively billing the program

Percentage of Medicaid eligible students that attend an LEA enrolled in the Nevada Medicaid SHS program

Number of students and percentage of school population receiving a Medicaid-billable service by county and statewide Percentage of Medicaid SHS claims that are for non-IEP services

Percentage of Medicaid SHS claims that are for mental health services





Final Program Evaluation Metrics

Evaluation Question 3: What is the impact on students of increased LEA participation and billing through the Nevada Medicaid SHS program?

Metric

Percentage of LEAs reporting that billing revenue supports increased investment in school health services and staffing Percentage of students that are chronically absent statewide and by LEA

Number of school health personnel employed by LEAs*

2024-25 Evaluation Snapshot

38% of school survey respondents agree that billing for SHS is an effective way to generate revenue for services that support students.

Current Status


- Based on stakeholder feedback, NVHA has developed the format and functionality of the resource
